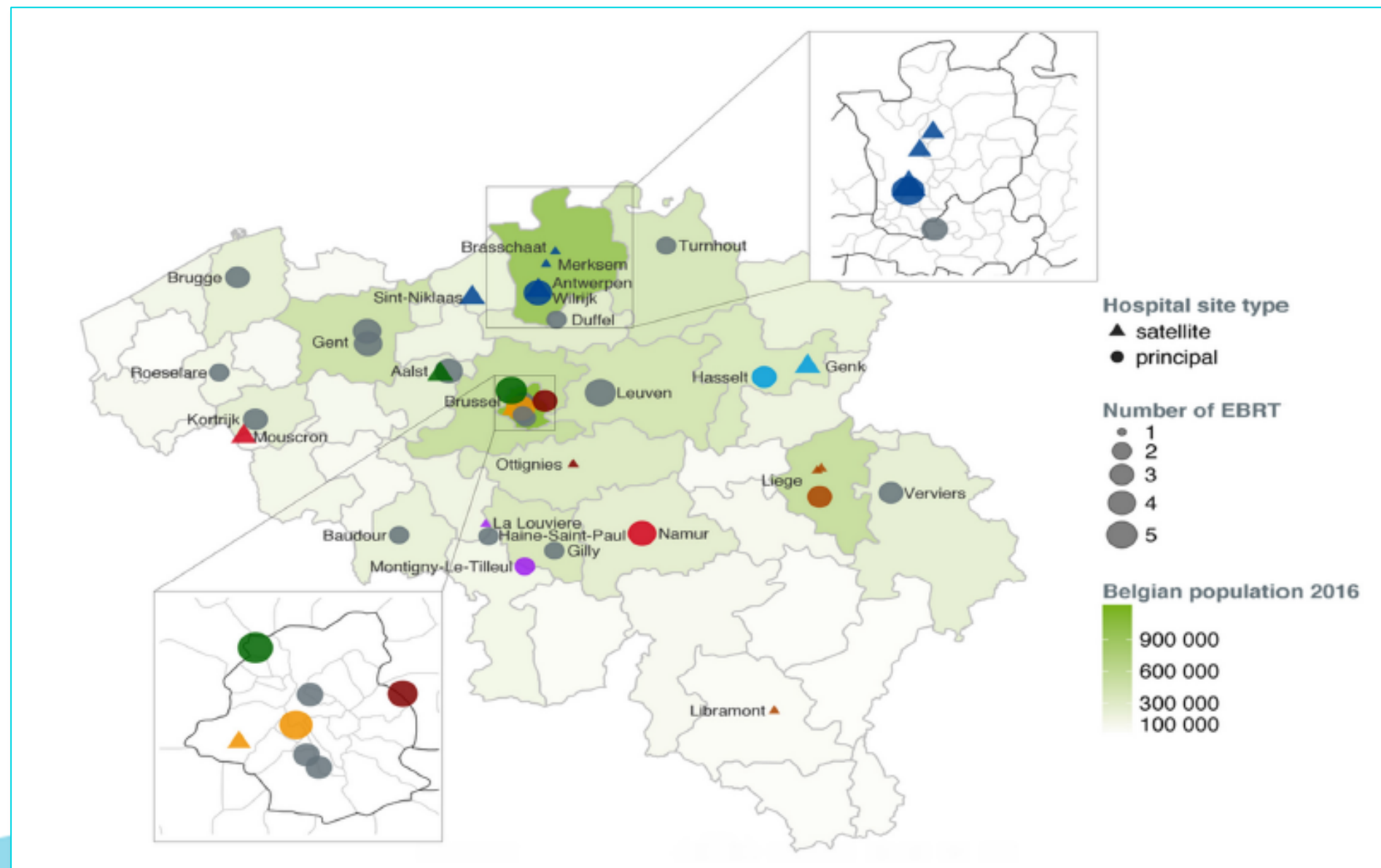

THE BELGIAN RADIOTHERAPY LANDSCAPE



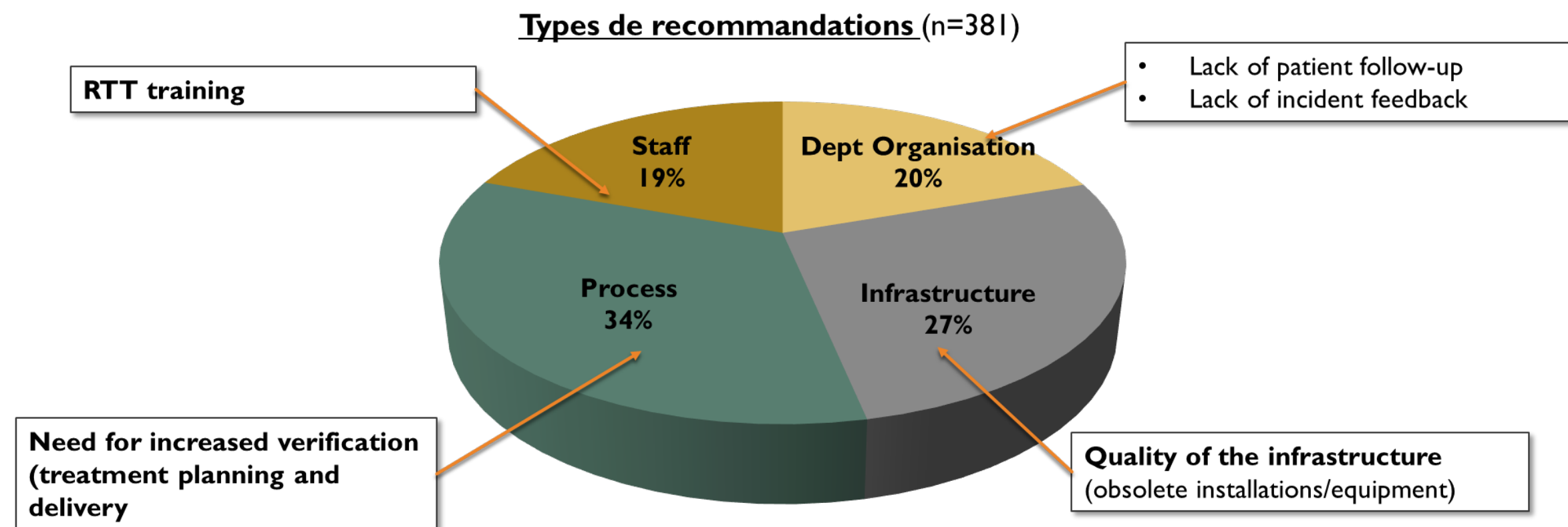
- 11,5 million habitants
- 24 radiotherapy departments (+ 11 sites satellites)
 - 6 university hospitals
 - Minimum 2 LINACS/department
- External Beam Radiotherapy equipment: 92
- ± 40.000 external beam radiotherapy treatments per year
- ± 1200 brachytherapy treatment per year

Clinical audits in radiotherapy in Belgium



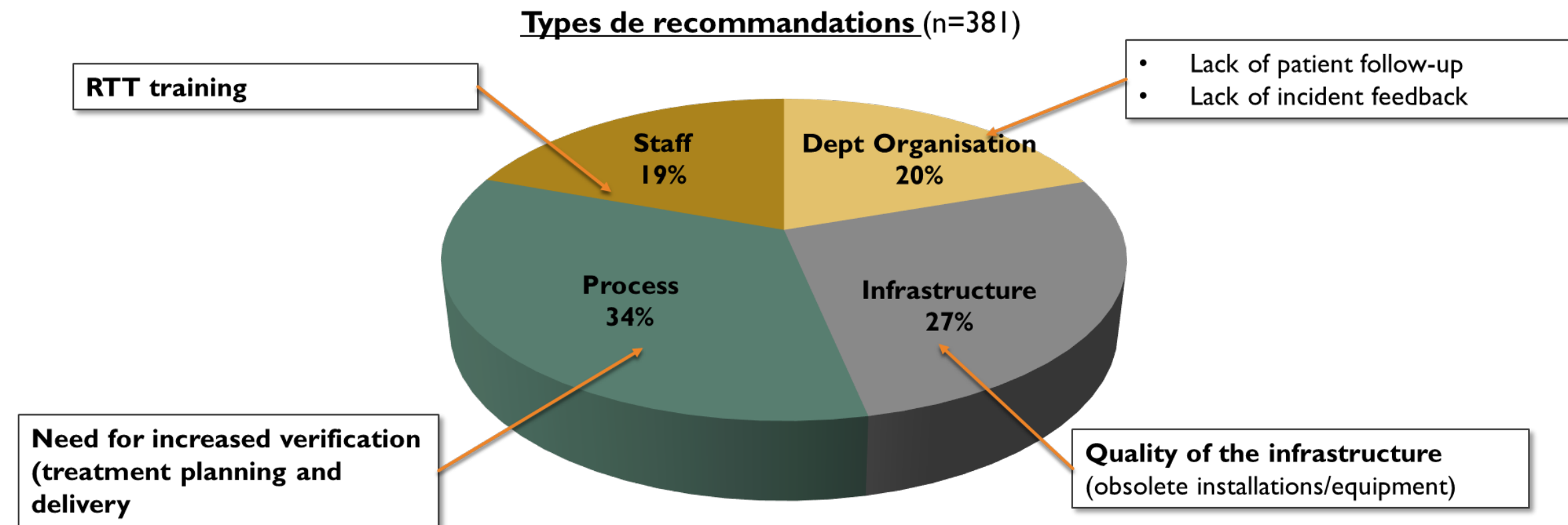
- **2011-2015:** QUATRO was used to audit **all Belgian RT departments**
- **Team of 14 auditors (RO, MP and RTT)**
 - Benefited from 2 days on site training
- **Contrary to QUATRO**
 - Exclusion of brachytherapy
 - Exclusion of LINAC/dosimetric measurements (→ BELdART*)
 - 3 days of audit per department (versus 5 days for QUATRO audits)
- **25 departments** were audited

Results of the 1st cycle of QUATRO audits



25 audits reports with **381 emitted recommendations**

Results of the 1st cycle of QUATRO audits



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Feedback from the audited departments

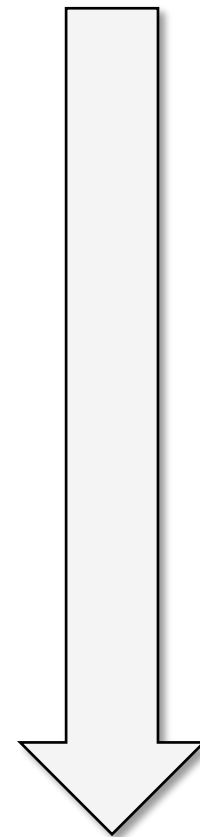


- **42,7% of the recommendations were evaluated as being very relevant**
→ those pertaining to staff and organizational issues scored as being most relevant
- **23.5% of the recommendations were deemed to have an important impact, the majority having a moderate impact (30.6%)**
→ those pertaining to process optimization deemed to have the most impact

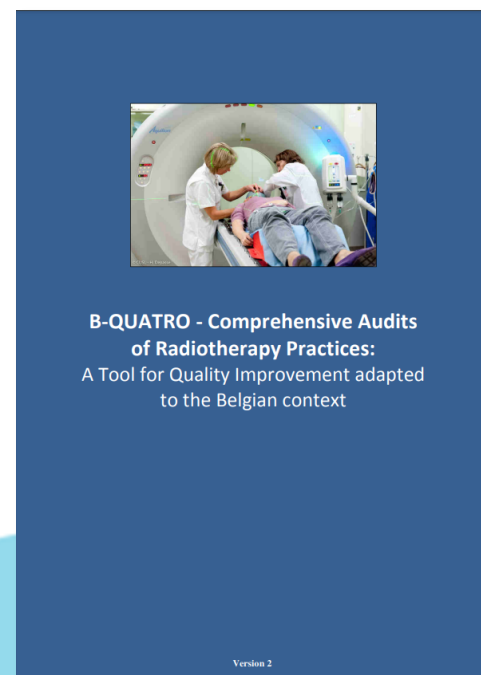
Belgium: from QUATRO to B-QUATRO



QUATRO: Comprehensive peer review clinical audits (2011-2015)



- Integration of **new technologies**
 - *SGRT, 4D planning and treatments, stereotactic treatments...*
- **Belgian** contextualization
 - *legislation, satellite sites...*
- Chapter focussing on **RT quality management (QM)**
 - *Additional quality criteria and checklists focussing on QM**
- **Rewording of the quality criteria** and reformatting of the audit checklist
- Development of **data analysis tool**
 - *Radar plots*

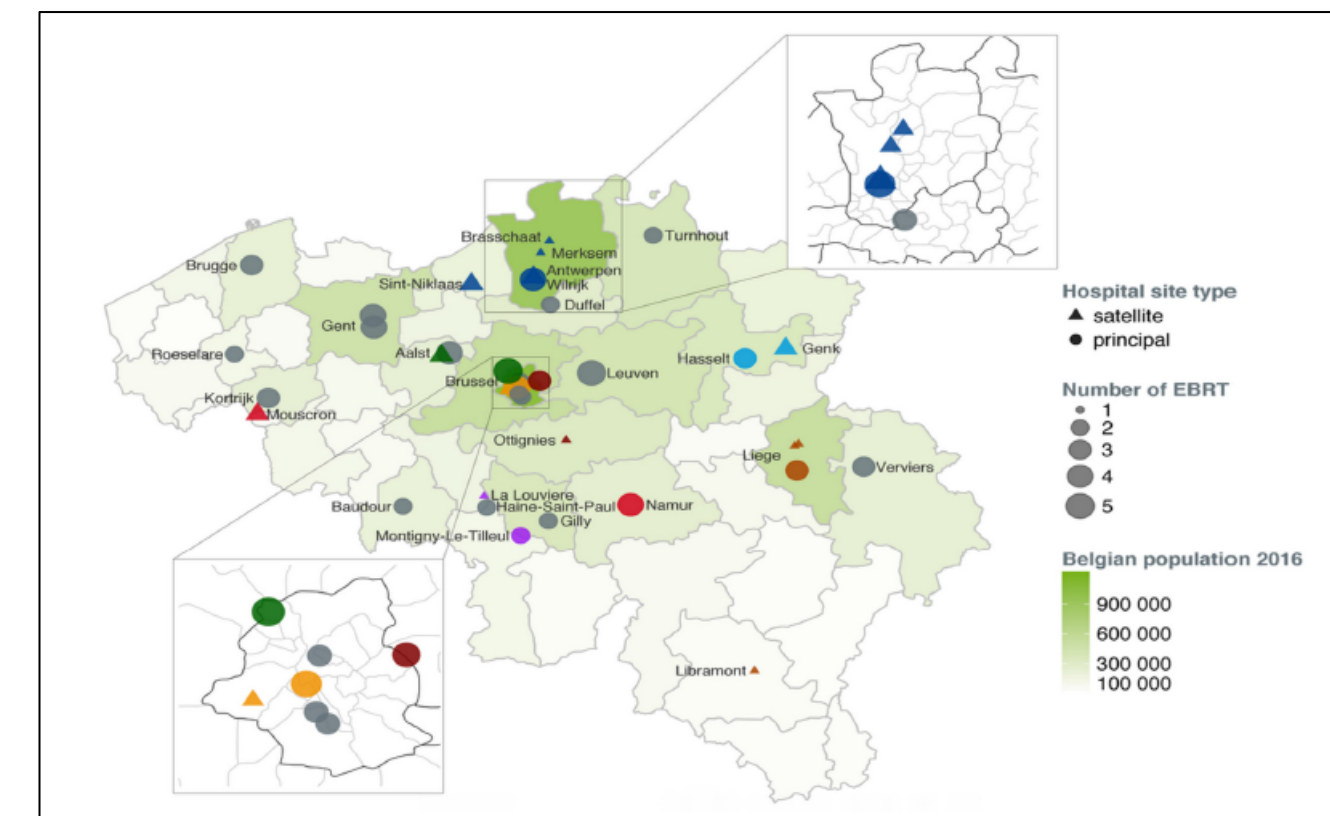

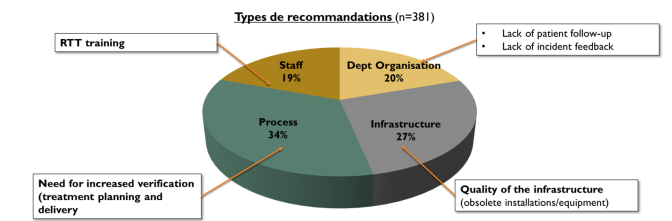

B-QUATRO audits

- **2017-2023: B-QUATRO** was used to audit **all Belgian RT departments**
 - Exclusion of brachytherapy =
 - Exclusion of LINAC/dosimetric measurements (→ BELdART*) =
 - 2½- 3½ audit days/department ↓
 - Inclusion of the quality managers within the audit team ↑
 - OneDrive platform to allow collaborative editing of the same document in real time
- **24 departments and their satellite sites (n=14)** were audited

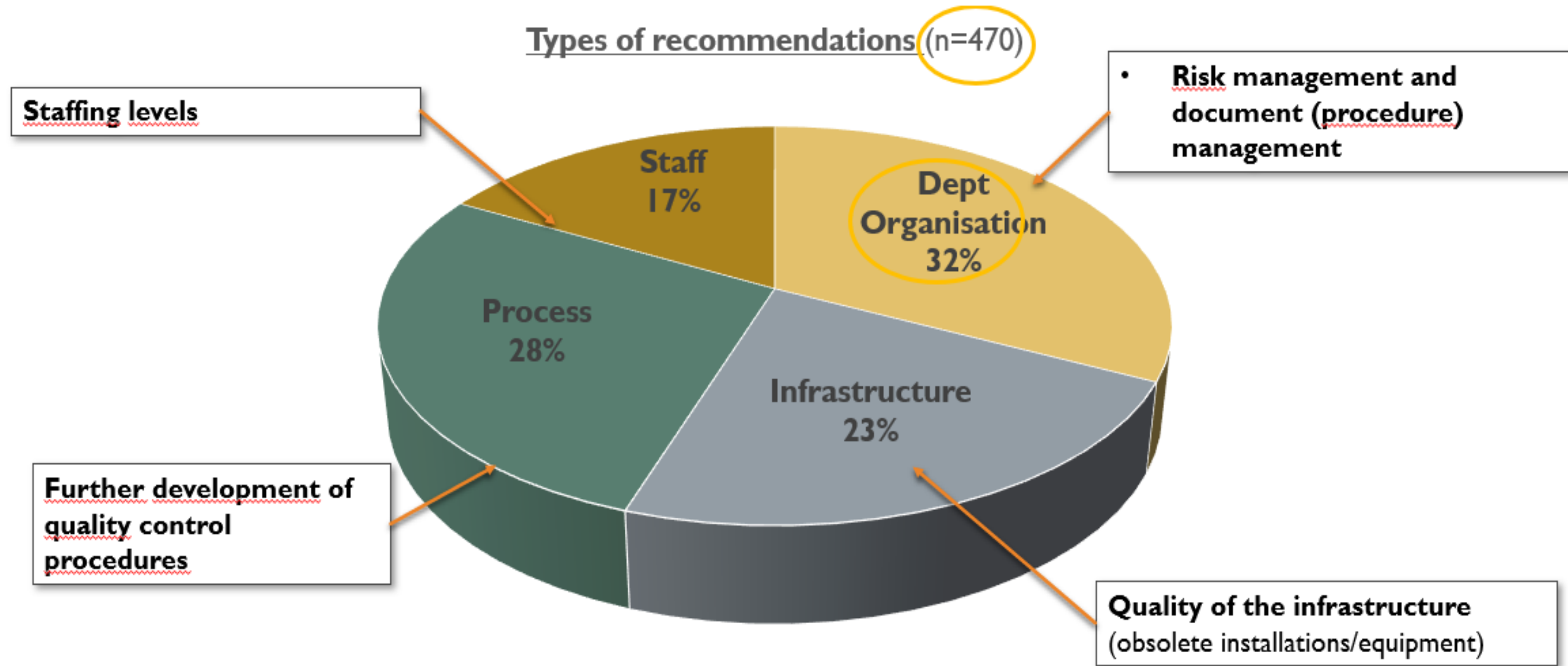

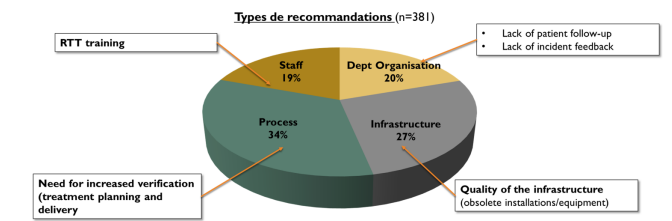

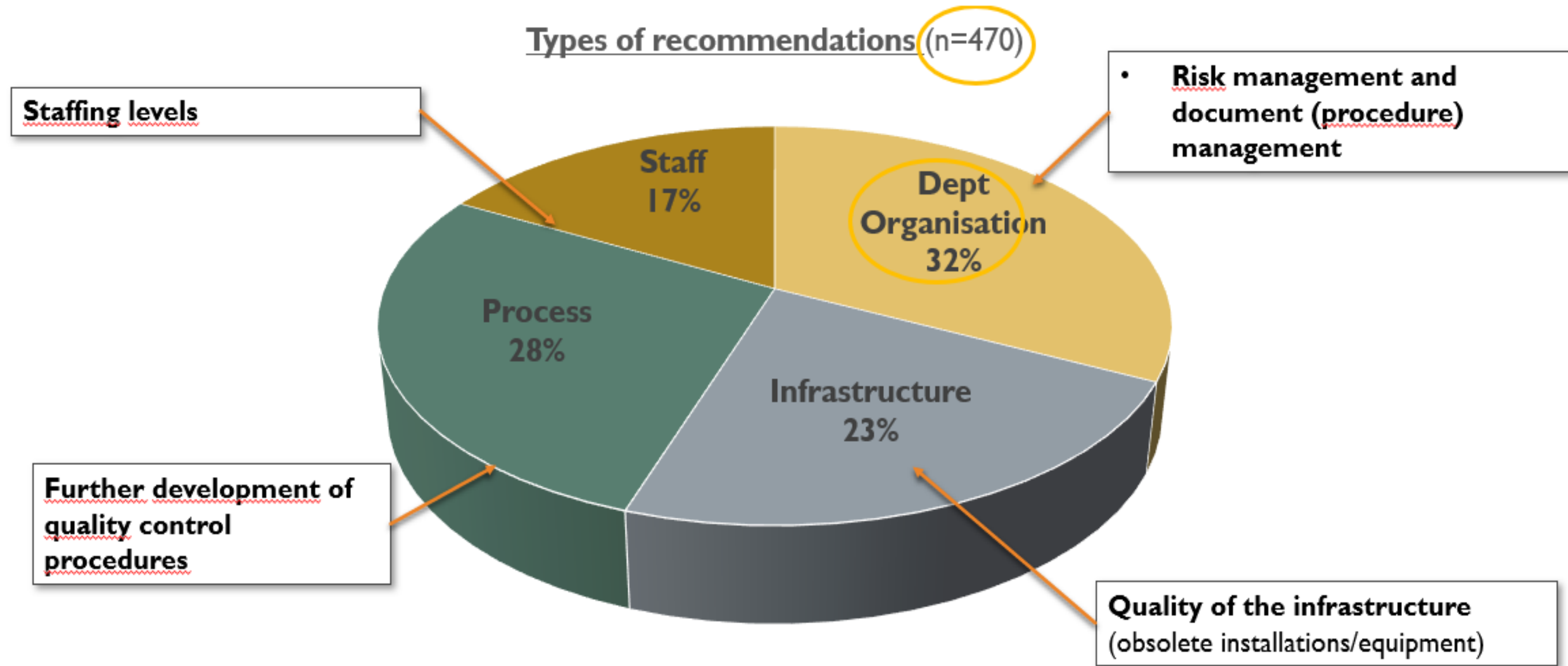

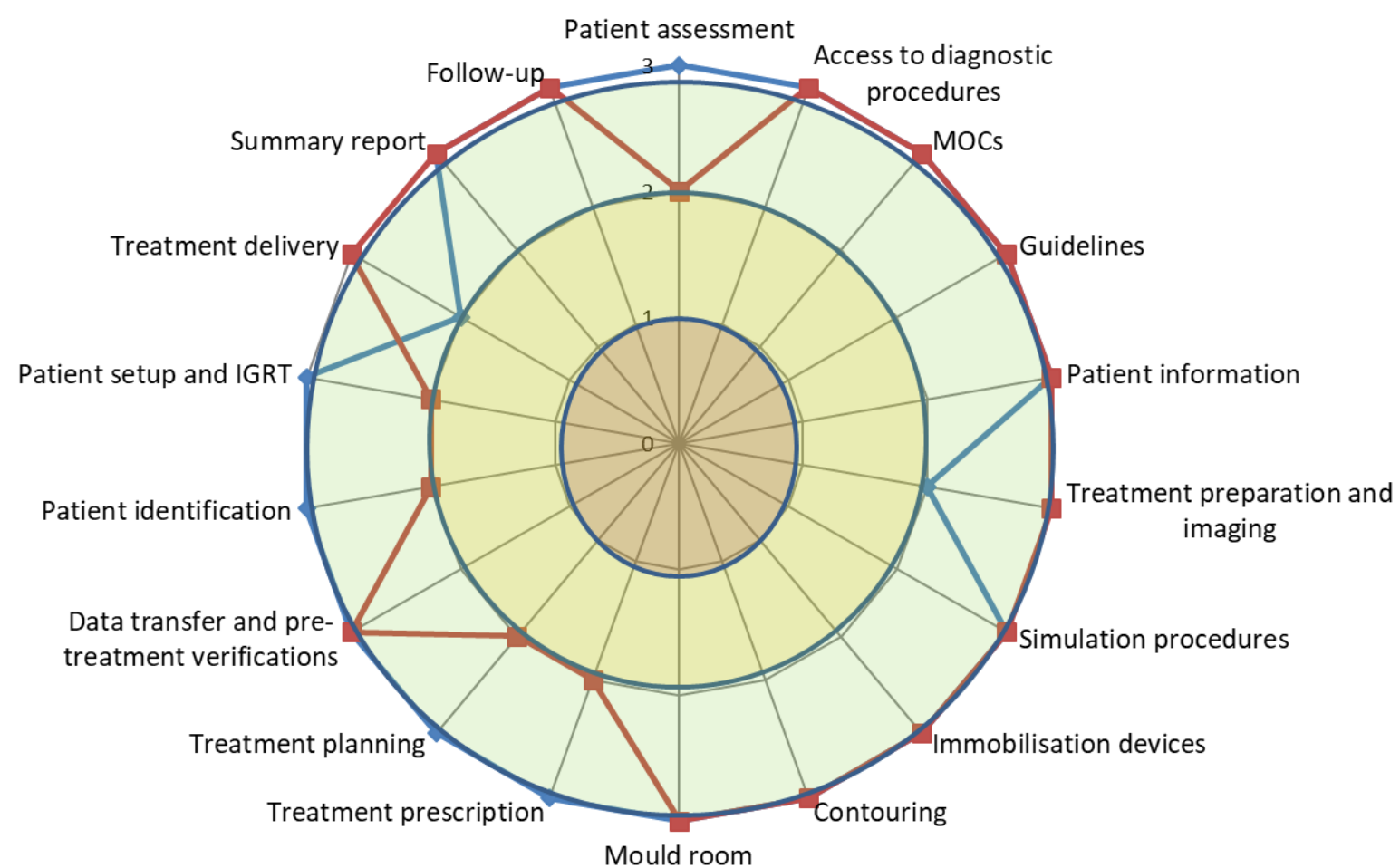

Department's audit compliancy rate for patient related procedures



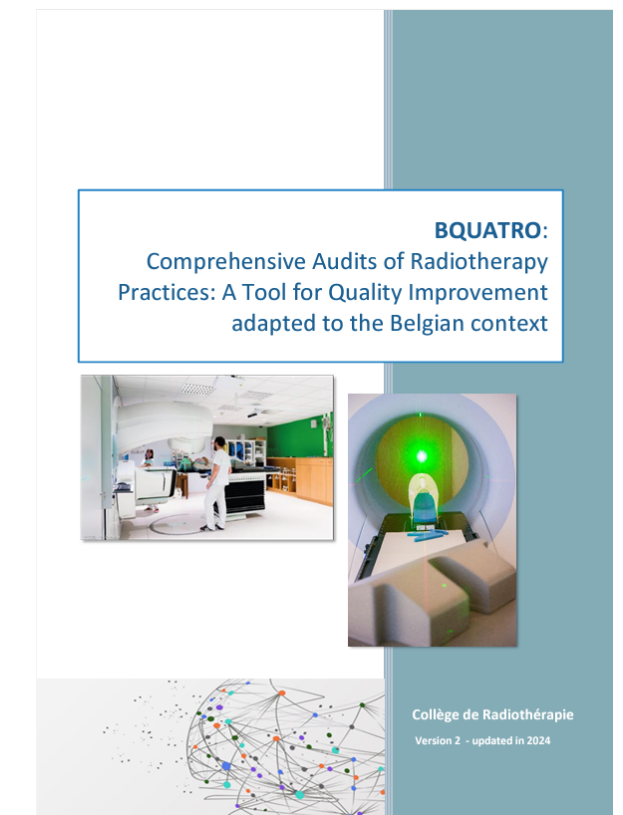
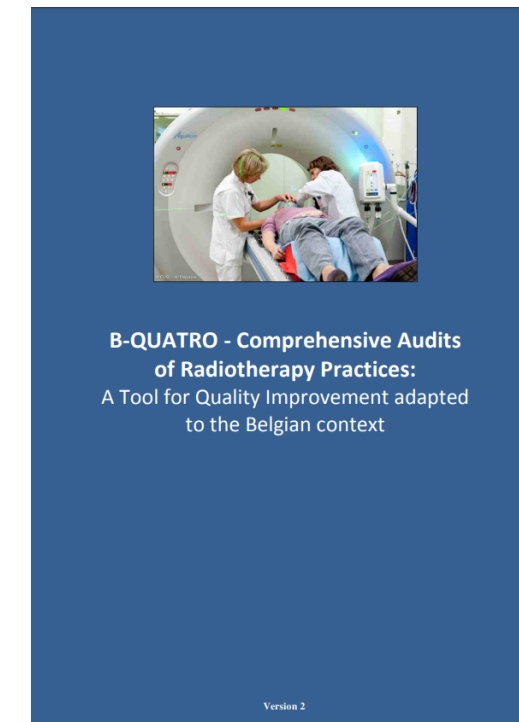

→ A majority of deficiencies observed during the first audits had been addressed by most departments.

BQUATRO I to BQUATRO II

- **2023 Review** of the B-QUATRO (BQUATRO I → BQUATRO II)
- **2024-2029: Third cycle** of audit using **B-QUATRO II**
 - Exclusion of brachytherapy =
 - Exclusion of LINAC/dosimetric measurements (→ BELdART) =
 - 3-4 audit days/department ↑
 - Team of 4 auditors =
 - « Old » and new auditors
 - all auditors were (re-)trained (audit methodology + soft skill required to audit) ✨
 - **Audited departments**
 - Can give feedback on the content of the report (2-3 weeks) ✨
 - Are sent a « audit satisfaction survey » right after the audit ✨

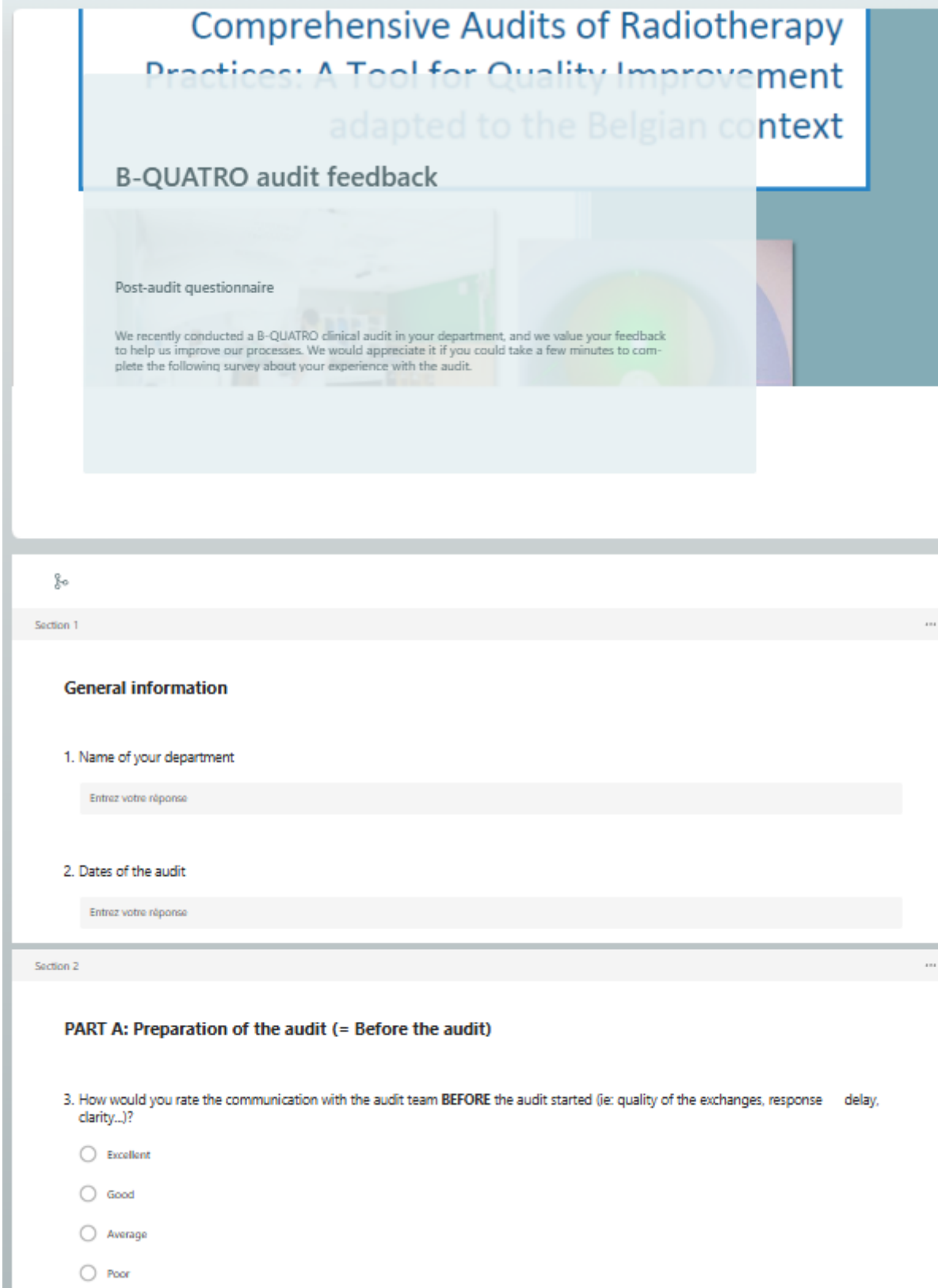


Audit satisfaction survey

Evaluation of:

- The preparation of the audit
 - Clear communication, clarity of the process
- The audit
 - Usefulness of the entrance briefing, audit organisation, auditor interactions, aspects covered, surprises, exit briefing, impact of the recommendations,
- Overall experience

- All departments have responded so far

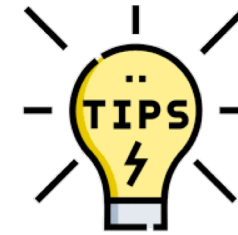

Lessons learned/Tips and tricks



- B-QUATRO needs to be **reviewed every 5 years** (change in practice, technological changes, lessons learned from the previous audits...)
- Auditors should benefit from **continuous training**
 - Formal training every 5 years
 - **Yearly auditor meetings** to be able to exchange on:
 - What went well and what did not go well
 - Issues with the audit process
 - Lessons learned
 - Questions concerning the checklist
- **Re-auditing** doesn't make things easier (!! sufficient number of audit days)
- **Sharing platfoms** (Onedrive/Google drive) facilitates the audit process
- Striking the **right balance** between earning departmental trust and upholding strict audit standards
- **Communicate**, communicate, communicate
